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# STABILITY

- **STABLE, AFFORDABLE HOUSING MAY REDUCE THE FREQUENCY OF UNWANTED MOVES THAT LEAD STUDENTS TO EXPERIENCE DISRUPTIONS IN HOME LIFE OR EDUCATIONAL INSTRUCTION.**

# EQUITY

- AFFORDABLE HOUSING CAN REDUCE OVERCROWDING AND OTHER SOURCES OF HOUSING-RELATED STRESS THAT LEAD TO POOR EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES BY ALLOWING FAMILIES TO AFFORD DECENT-QUALITY HOMES OF THEIR OWN.

- VOCATIONAL MAJORS 14.37 %
